Developmental Services

Residential, community support and day programs help individuals live more independently, by cultivating their skills and connections with employers, community partners and families.

Community Justice Day and Residential Programs

Developmental Services Potential Made Possible...

By Determination and Perseverance

Connie * is a young woman with a developmental disability who also struggles with the trauma of having been in an abusive relationship for many years. Last year she lost custody of her child and has been transient, staying on and off with her parents. Connie was focused on getting her life back and securing a better future for herself and her daughter.

Aprile Hutcheson, a Springboard Family Support Coordinator, was determined to help Connie address the hurdles of regaining custody of her child. With her help, Connie found a two-bedroom apartment with Toronto Community Housing, received funding from the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board and subsidized daycare for her daughter. With a stable plan in place the Court supported Connie in regaining custody of her child. This support was a life changer for Connie and her entire family!

Employment Services (ES) Potential Made Possible...

By Encouraging Abilities





Last year, Nana, a shy young high school student, attended Springboard's ES program looking for work and was unsure about whether to pursue post-secondary education. Like many teenagers he did not know what he wanted to do after high school. Through our pre-employment training, Nana was able to build his communication skills and self-confidence as he actively involved himself in group activities and workplace role play.

When Nana returned to our ES program this year, we were thrilled to learn that he was enrolled in a post-secondary Social Service Work program and, this time, was looking for a student placement position. Nana exuded a high level of confidence and poise and joined the team as a placement student for Youth Job Connection-Summer and Youth Job Connection. He participated in outreach events, connected with community partners and youth, and even assisted in the implementation of Springboard's March Break Job Fair. Nana is making his potential possible!









Community Justice Potential Made Possible...

By Overcoming Obstacles

Michael* has experienced many social barriers in his life and was discouraged that he was not making much progress in achieving what he knew was possible. Springboard's Youth Connect, a diversion program, provided Michael with the supports he needed at the right time. He was successful in becoming a recipient of a Springboard Cameron Scholarship. In his application for this, Michael said; "At the beginning, I was reluctant in taking part in the programs that Springboard offered. However, when I realized the positive changes it was doing to me, I decided to continue participating.....the skills and strengths that I have learned from Springboard helped me realize that I want to be a part of something that helps me give back to my community in the way that Springboard and their staff helped me".

Michael went on to college and recently graduated from Centennial College's two year Community Justice Program. Michael became the first one in his family to complete post-secondary education!

Nicole Bellussi, Assistant Supervisor, is so delighted to have helped Michael along his path and proudly acknowledges he is starting his own business acquiring the appropriate insurance and licensing requirements. Michael is giving back as a volunteer at a local community Hub in his neighborhood and hopes to move on to his next goal of attending University and making more of his dreams a reality.
